MODERN SLAVERY ACT 2015: SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING STATEMENT

INTRODUCTION

Modern slavery is a crime and a violation of fundamental human rights. It may take different forms, such as a slavery, forced labour, human trafficking.

The UK Modern Slavery Act 2015 requires business to state the actions they have taken during the financial year to ensure modern slavery is not taking place in their operations and supply chains. We are fully committed to playing our part in eradicating modern slavery. We firmly advocate for transparency and collaboration to eliminate the risks of modern slavery.

As an organization we have considered the exposure of Agrofertrans Ltd. to slavery and human trafficking risks, after considering:

- To the best of our knowledge, we have no information about facts of slavery and human trafficking in our supply chain operations;
- The skilled nature of the activities and roles undertaken across the company, and the skill set and qualifications required to perform these activities, minimizing our use of temporary or low-skilled agency staff;
- The application of our policies and processes, including procurement and recruitment processes;
- Encouragement of staff or external individuals to raise concerns in line with our Anti-Slavery policy.

As a result of the factors above we consider the risk of slavery or human trafficking occurring within our direct employee population, business operations and tier one supply chain to be low (and have found no evidence of slavery or human trafficking in our business or supply chains). This will be kept under review.

POLICIES AND PROCEDURES ON MODERN SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING

We are committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in our supply chain or in any part of our business. Our anti-slavery position reflects our commitment to acting ethically and with integrity in all our business relationships and to implementing and enforcing effective systems and controls to ensure slavery and human trafficking is not taking place anywhere in our supply chain.

We, Agrofertrans Ltd., believe it is essential to provide a work climate that:

- Respects the dignity and worth of individuals;
- Encourage the initiative of each employee;
- Challenge individual capabilities;
- Provide equal opportunities.

Honor, dignity, freedom and comfort of our employees are the biggest values of our company. To this end, Agrofertrans Ltd has adopted strong employment, labor and worker protection principles that apply to our employees. Agrofertrans Ltd prohibits workplace harassment and we respect workers' freedom to associate, which assures we respect the ability of employees to choose whether or not to join unions and engage in collective bargaining, as permitted by applicable laws in the countries where Agrofertrans Ltd does business.

We prohibit the use of forced and bonded labor, which we interpret to include slavery and human trafficking, or the employment of children under 16 years of age, or the minimum age established by local law if older. Agrofertrans Ltd takes all necessary steps to assure the occupational health and safety of our workers and the safety of the communities in which we operate.

As an organization we work based on the following principles:

- Freedom of movement;
- Freedom of association;
- Prohibition of any threat of violence, harassment and intimidation;
- Prohibition of the use of worker-paid recruitment fees;
- Prohibition of compulsory overtime;
- Prohibition of child labor;
- Prohibition of discrimination;
- Prohibition of confiscation of worker's original identification documents;
- Provision of access to remedy, compensation and justice for victims of modern slavery.

DUE DILIGENCE PROCESSES IN RELATION TO SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING

As part of our initiative to identify and mitigate risk we have systems in place to:

- Identify and assess potential risk areas when considering taking on new suppliers and regularly review our existing supply chains;
- Review the potential for risk at regular intervals, including the possibility of re-auditing a supplier or conducting spot checks;
- Mitigate the risk of slavery and human trafficking occurring in our supply chains;
- Monitor potential risk areas in our supply chains;
- Protect whistle blowers.

Our employees are obliged to report to the senior management in case they identify the risk of modern slavery and human trafficking.

RISK OF SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING AND STEPS TO MANAGE THE RISK

To combat the risk of slavery and human trafficking, we take steps to identify those areas of our business and our supply chains where there may be a risk of slavery and human trafficking.

We apply a risk-based approach when assessing counterparties operating in higher-risk jurisdictions.

Also, we assess potential partners, suppliers and buyers based on a variety of factors to prevent working with companies that might be at a risk of non-conformance with our values and principles. This assessment is made in a form of partner risk evaluation process and includes evaluation of such factors as geographical risk, business risk, type of operations, etc. We work only with carefully assessed, well-known and reputable partners. Suppliers are expected to comply with our ethical standards and anti-slavery principles.

To effectively identify and mitigate the risk of slavery and human trafficking we may engage with other businesses, suppliers and associations where appropriate to navigate risks of slavery and human trafficking.

Employees and external parties may report concerns confidentially through management channels.

Steps taken during the previous financial year to ensure that modern slavery is not taking place in the supply chain and/or in any part of our business included the following:

- Updated training for employees on modern slavery risks has been conducted instructing employees about such risks, possible exposure and the ways to report in case they identify the risk of modern slavery;
- Separate training for the employees and staff working in trading to instruct about features of modern slavery risks to pay attention to in cooperation with suppliers, buyers, customers, and partners;
- Re-consideration of the list of factors we assess potential suppliers and buyers on to prevent working with companies that might be at a risk of modern slavery;
- Management meetings conducted to review our due diligence procedure;
- Review of the geographical scope of our operations to include all the locations to our due diligence processes.

MEASURING EFFECTIVENESS

Agrofertrans Ltd is committed to measuring and continuously improving the effectiveness of our due diligence process regarding modern slavery and human trafficking. To that end, our senior management holds regular meetings throughout the year to review our due diligence and risk assessment system described above.
